"Learning with and from each other" at the product training in Klagenfurt

From 07. to 13. June 2015 the product training for qualified workers from Latvia, Romania, Germany, Czech Republic and Austria took place in Klagenfurt.

For the first time all instruments of the pedagogical 3-stepmodel were used, approbated and discussed.

Qualified persons were trained and prepared as propagator for teaching the methods and the model in institutions of their own region

The training was organized by the Jugendförderverein Parchim (Germany) and the Kärntner Volkshochschulen (Austria).



The program was extensive and diversified. All participants experienced themselves as learners.



The participants got to know the different learning and teaching methods, worked in various workshops and were sensitized for basic education needs. Furthermore we visited an organization in which young adults with basic education needs work and learn. The Jugendförderverein Pachim also introduced a best practice example from Germany.

The week's highlight was the project work, in which the participants could try and test the model and all its methods and develop ideas and concepts for the individual implementation in their own organizations.



At the end of the week the trainees presented and discussed the results of the project work. Finally the training was evaluated and each participant got a certificate.
